















Bartlett Rock Art Panel

The Bartlett Rock Art Panel is located in the north-facing alcove in front of you. These rock art figures are thousands of years old. (Barrier style figures are named after Barrier Creek, Utah, where they were first identified. This area is more commonly known as Horseshoe Canyon). Pictographs are painted figures. (Petroglyphs, which are far more common, are pecked out of the rock.)

PLEASE help us protect this unique and precious treasure. These figures are an example of our heritage, and are irreplaceable. Consider yourself in a shrine, and act accordingly. NEVER touch the figures, as the oil in your skin can harm them. Look at them and enjoy them, but do no harm to them.
