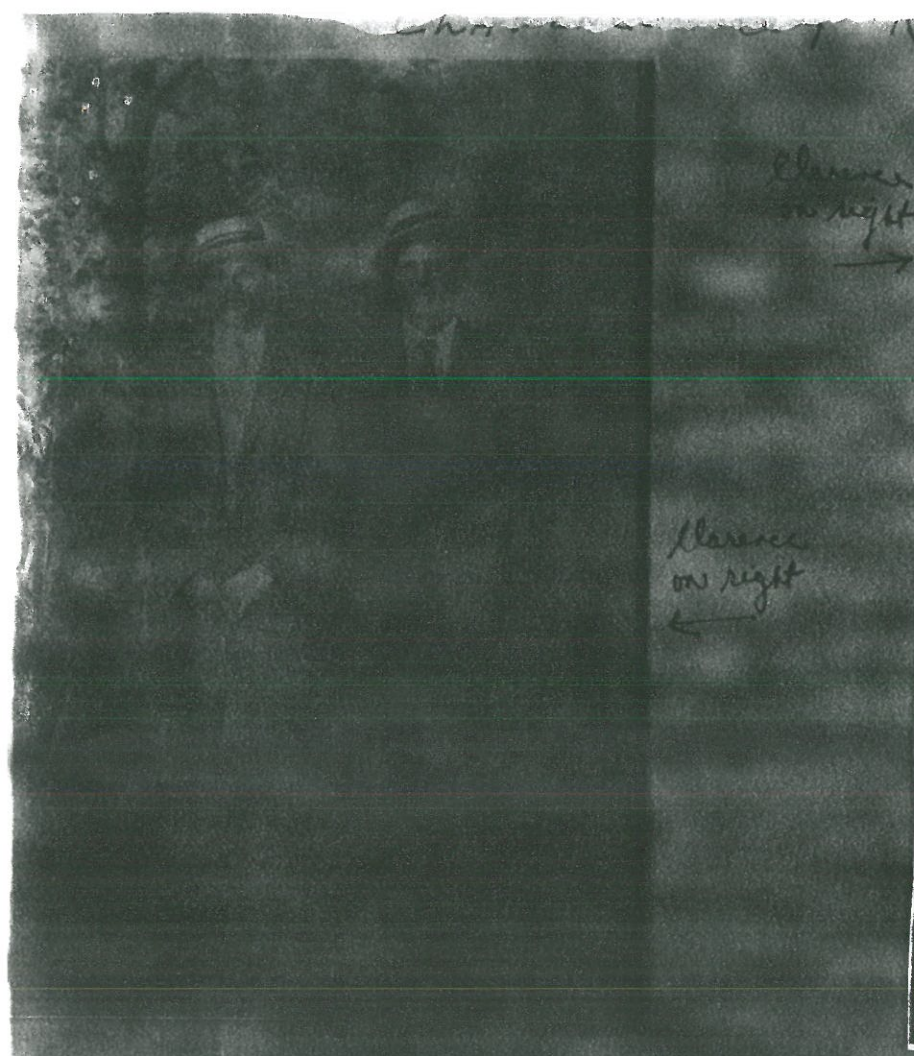

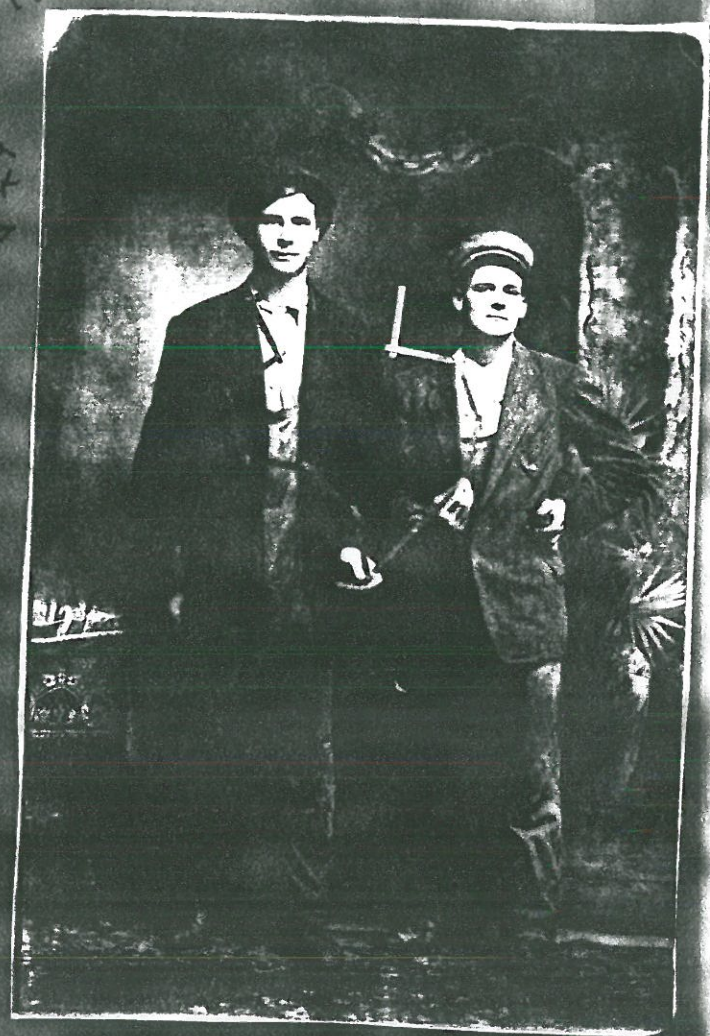

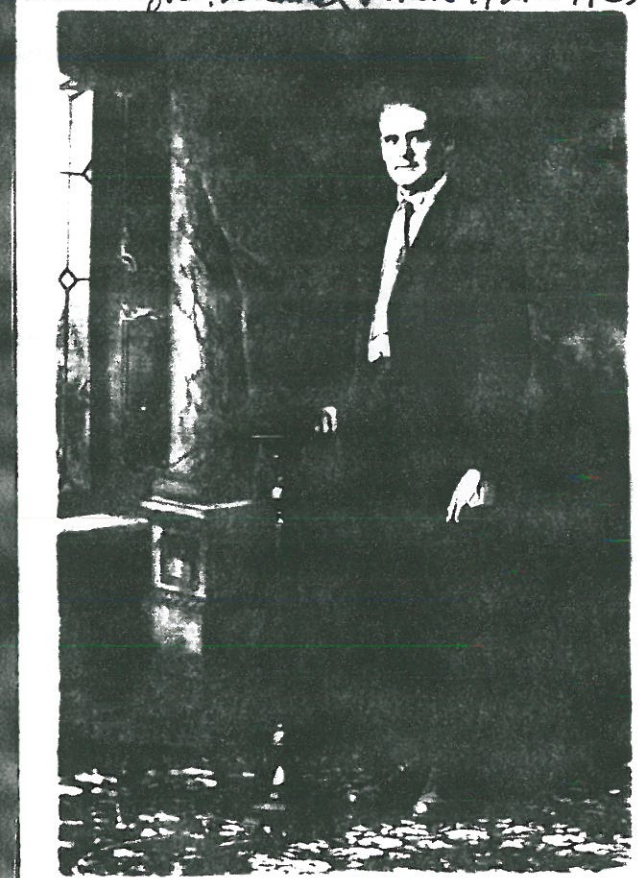

EASE FROM PROBATION

At the February 1917 meeting of the Ohio Board of Administration, your Absolute Release was authorized to take effect, February 24th, 1917.

Having complied with the conditions of your Probation, and having shown your ability to maintain yourself and your character in ordinary society, there is no reason to prevent your becoming a well-to-do, respected and useful citizen. Your Absolute release is ordered, hoping that our expectation will be fulfilled.

As soon as released from custody, you shall proceed at once to place of employment provided for you, viz:

JAMES CULVER, Lima, O.

In case you find it necessary or desirable to change your employment or residence, you shall first obtain the written consent of the Warden, Parole Clerk, or Parole Officer of the Penitentiary.

You shall, on the first day of each month, until your final release, according to law, forward by mail to the Parole Clerk a report of yourself, stating whether you have been constantly under pay during the last month, and if not, why not; how much you have earned, how much you have expended, as well as any further statement which you desire to make concerning yourself.

These reports are to be made on blanks, (and envelopes) which are furnished for this purpose, and must reach the Parole Clerk not later than the fifth of the month.

Advise at once if out of blanks, or if blanks become lost, and new supply will be furnished.

THE REPORTS MUST BE FILLED OUT COMPLETELY, giving DATE AND NAME, in full, Street address, and City. The EMPLOYER MUST SIGN EACH AND EVERY REPORT before being sent in.

REPORTS MUST BE SENT IN WHETHER YOU ARE WORKING OR NOT.

You shall in all respects conduct yourself honestly, avoid evil associations and obey the law.

Frequenting saloons, drinking, or loafing around questionable places or with disreputable characters will positively not be tolerated, and any excuses for violation of same will not be accepted.

A special condition of your parole is:

You are not eligible to vote while on parole.

You shall, while on parole, remain in legal custody, and under control of The Ohio Board of Administration.

You shall be liable to be retaken and confined within the enclosure of the Penitentiary for any reason that shall be satisfactory to said Board, and at their sole discretion, and shall remain therein until released by law.

You shall, at all times, remain within the boundaries of the State of Ohio.

Final release from parole can be effected only through the Parole Officers, or by the Warden, and warning is given against the expenditures of money to any persons for this purpose.

When you have satisfactorily met the conditions of said parole, you will be given a final release and will be discharged from further supervision, provided, however, that the period of parole shall not be less than the minimum nor more than the maximum term for which you might have been imprisoned.

In case of any difficulty, or if out of employment, or unable to work on account of sickness, you shall freely communicate the fact to the Parole Officer or Parole Clerk.
